Bonner County OEM participated in the October 17-18, 2018 Lake Pend Oreille Geographic Response Plan (GRP) emergency response boom deployment exercise. BNSF has partnered with Bonner County and other stakeholders to update and test the Lake Pend Oreille GRP booming strategies and continues to collaborate to improve response plans and equipment deployment preparedness training in the event of an incident occurs in the LPO watershed.

BNSF has worked to refine the response strategies for the Long Bridge and the Clark Fork Delta by suggesting improvements to the strategy plans and by testing them. Additionally, BNSF recently mobilized additional response equipment to Sandpoint and the Clark Fork delta, including 3 mobile reels with 6,000 feet of boom, oil recovery skimmers, a Current Buster, and an airboat (delivery Jan. 2019). Use of the boom reels and airboat were demonstrated during the October exercise.

BNSF has exhibited a strong commitment to continue these efforts going forward, recognizing that an effective GRP requires testing and review.
